Arrest made in Fatal Hit and Run Traffic Collision

Date of Incident: 9/22/2017

UPDATED INFORMATION:

Colton Police Detectives and members of the MAIT team conducted follow up of the fatal hit and run traffic collision that occurred on September 22, 2017. The suspected driver who fled the scene of the collision was identified as 18 year old Ulysses Carbajal Carranza from Moreno Valley, CA. On September 26, 2017 Detectives located Carbajal Carranza at his residence. Carbajal Carranza was later arrested for PC192(c)(1)-Gross Vehicular Manslaughter and VC20001-Hit and Run. He was then booked into San Bernardino County Jail.

INFORMATION FROM ORIGINAL PRESS RELEASE:

On September 22, 2017 at approximately 5:06 pm, Colton Police officers responded to a multi-vehicle traffic collision at Reche Canyon Road and Scotch Lane. Upon arrival officer's discovered a motorcyclist was involved in the collision and sustained major injuries. The motorcyclist was transported by ambulance to Loma Linda University Medical Center for treatment. The motorcyclist identified as Steven Owen Jarrell 59 years old, of Perris succumbed to his injuries. The driver of the second vehicle fled the scene on foot into Reche Canyon. An extensive search by the Colton Police Department, San Bernardino County Sheriff's Aviation, and K-9 teams from the Colton Police Department and San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department was conducted; however the suspect was not located. The Colton Police Department's MAIT team and Detective Division responded and are actively investigating the collision.
