DUI Checkpoint Nets 2 Arrests

Colton, Calif. – The Colton Police Department had 2 DUI related arrests while conducting a DUI/Driver's License checkpoint on September 28th, 2019. The checkpoint was in the 2600 block of Reche Canyon Road between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m.

In addition, 17 drivers were cited for operating a vehicle unlicensed or with a suspended/revoked license, 490 vehicles were screened, 19 citations issued and 1 vehicle towed.

DUI Checkpoints are placed in locations based on collision statistics and frequency of DUI arrests. Last year the Colton Police Department investigated 35 DUI collisions that killed 2 people and injured 49 others.

Drivers caught driving impaired and charged with DUI can expect the impact of a DUI arrest to be approximately \$13,500. This includes fines, fees, DUI classes, license suspension and other expenses not to mention possible jail time.

The Colton Police Department reminds drivers that "DUI Doesn't Just Mean Booze." Prescription drugs, particularly those with a driving or operating machinery warning on the label, can impair and result in a DUI. Marijuana can also be impairing, especially in combination with alcohol or other drugs.

The Colton Police Department will be conducting several upcoming DUI Saturation Patrols in our ongoing commitment to take suspected impaired drivers off our streets and highways, ultimately lowering the risk for deaths and injuries.
